DPHHS HAN Update 2023-13: Updates on Locally Acquired Malaria

Malaria is a serious disease caused by protozoan parasites of the genus Plasmodium that is transmitted to humans through the bite of an infected Anopheles mosquito. In Montana, an average of two cases of malaria are reported in residents each year, after travel internationally to a country where malaria is endemic. While Texas, Florida, and Maryland have reported cases of locally acquired malaria, the risk of local malaria transmission in Montana is very low. However, multiple species of Anopheles spp. mosquitoes can be found throughout Montana, most notably A. freeborni. Other types of mosquitoes in Montana, including Culex and Aedes, cannot transmit malaria, however Culex mosquitoes are the vector that transmits West Nile virus in Montana.

A concise, scalable surge response template can be a helpful quick reference to the hospital personnel tasked with expanding care capacity in the first hours of an incident and can minimize ad hoc and potentially

conflicting decisions about prioritization of space and strategies. Health Care Facility Onboarding Checklist

During a pandemic or other emergency, health care facilities face significant challenges to quickly onboard additional health care providers when hospital admissions and intensive care units' occupancy rapidly increase. The recently updated Health Care Facility Onboarding Checklist can help facilities ensure new employees are compliant with administrative requirements, familiar with the mission and culture of the hospital, and understand expectations.

Data & Situational Awareness

Hospital COVID-19 Reporting Requirements

The COVID-19-related data reporting is important in supporting surveillance of, and response to, COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses. The Federal Partners appreciate the continued efforts for completing this important reporting.

In its FY 2023 Hospital Inpatient Prospective Payment System (IPPS) and Long-Term Care Hospital Prospective Payment System (LTCH PPS) Final Rule (CMS-1771-F), the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) finalized a revision to the hospital and CAH infection prevention and control conditions of participation (CoP) requirements that requires hospitals and CAHs, after the conclusion of the COVID-19 PHE, to continue reporting on a reduced number of COVID-19 data elements until April 30, 2024, unless the Secretary establishes an earlier ending date.

At this time there is no extension of the requirement planned beyond April 30, 2024. NHSN's capability to receive COVID-19 data from hospitals will continue after April 30, 2024 and reporting into this system will be optional after this time.

CDC will share any guidance around reporting requirement changes when they are issued by CMS.
